♦ WAS NOT THE BIBLE USED TO ENSLAVE, ABUSE, DESTROY, REPRESS, DIVIDE VARIOUS CLASSES OF PEOPLE OVER THE CENTURIES? ISN'T THIS TRUE?

Friend, ironically we can find suitable response to this with an adage from the age-old secular page: "The devil can cite Scripture for his purpose."-William Shakespeare, The Merchant of Venice. Indeed over the centuries, many devils of men have misused the Bible for the grossest of agendas. But such has been the work of devils and not the Bible. Men have also committed wrongs in the name of Muslim, Hindu, Buddhist texts, the writings of Communism, Capitalism, Race Supremacy, and a great many other ideologies. Have not men of all ages, and even our present age likewise been unjust in the very administration of justice? Have known murderers and criminals gotten free? Yes. Do we then throw out the law which says, "Thou shalt not murder", because a murderer got off? No! We realize that evil men (or a lack of good men) can cause a system of good laws to be abused. Same with the Bible. If it be ignorant to throw out "Thou shalt not murder", it is likewise ignorant to throw out the Bible, because evil men have abused the Good Book.

And why can we say it is the "Good Book"? Because for all of the societal ills it has been accused – slavery, oppression of women, racial supremacy etc. – not one of these have been sanctioned by the Bible. A careful, unprejudiced read of Scripture would dispel many of these assertions. As this pamphlet format limits how much detail can be shed, we at least suffice some verses of the Bible which should cause you to ask yourself: Does the Bible actually support the evils some people ascribe to it?

Slavery

Firstly, would it be shocking to tell you that in the entire Bible there is only one proper mention of "slave"? And guess what? It is in condemnation of the practice, speaking of the sins of Babylon and its judgment. Revelation 18:10-11-13>> 10Standing after off for the fear of her torment, saying, Alas, alas, that great city Babylon, that mighty city! for in one hour is thy judgment come. 11 And the merchants of the earth shall weep and mourn over her; for no man buyeth their

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things. Many misconstrue the two, and such is why all the face of the earth... they say the Bible supports slavery. But we ask, do people work for people today? Do some employees live in their employer's home, sometimes for years on end? Is that slavery? Do you call that cruelty? Well, this is the servanthood of the Bible. A verse by verse, detailed study is needed to cover this issue more fully, but we pray at least this introduction would have cleared up some assumptions on this topic.

For the categories following, we ask you to suffice with the thought that, these verses undeniably reveal a different reality than what the Bible critics care to admit.

Oppression of Women

Rebekah had a choice in going to marry Isaac: Genesis 24:57-58>> 57 And they said, We will call the damsel, and enquire at her mouth. ⁵⁸And they called Rebekah, and said unto her, Wilt thou go with this man? And she said, I

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Well, friend, by this we would have consensus that the Bible, at the very least, is a legitimate source of faith for the Christian. Though we can accept this, some may think that though the written Word exists, it need not instruct us. But think about this. How will we determine what is the voice of God from what is not? What is the function of the Spirit and how will we properly recognize it? From what unalterable source alone can we find the gospel of Christianity properly explained? How could all people ever truly gain a witness to the fact that a Saviour called Christ came to this earth to save us?

Friend, the truth is, without the Bible, nothing of what we call Christianity is a certainty. God infinitely knew that in order for man to understand the plan of salvation offered to all, a fully inspired, ageenduring record of His dealings with humanity was absolutely necessary. Hence He gave us the Bible, the Word – an ever-abiding, tangible transcript between God and man, that is yet able to transform the heart. If you would have Christ, you would have the Bible; if you would have the Spirit, you would have the Bible. And in this day and age – when access to this Word is virtually ubiquitous - if you would have salvation, you would definitely need the Bible.

From henceforth we shall let the Bible - Holy Scripture itself speak of its own necessity regarding all aspects of the Christian faith:

I Corinthians 15:3-4>> 3For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; ⁴And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures.

Psalms 138:2>> ²I will worship toward thy holy temple, and praise thy name for thy lovingkindness and for thy truth: for thou hast magnified thy word above all thy name.

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
